Plans Reviewed	<ul> <li>BGHCC Executive Committee reviewed the Coalition Response Plan. Within the plan are references and plans regarding CSEPP which is swiftly coming to a close. Though there is no longer a threat to communities within the CSEPP counties associated with chemical munitions, the Executive Committee decided to keep this information within the plan for at least another year until the official close-out of CSEPP in 2024. There is one more planned exercise associated with CSEPP to occur in June of next year which will test our regional response capabilities.</li> <li>Dave also addressed plan language regarding asset requests. He mentioned that when an agency has needs for responding to an emergency, Dave or JT can be contacted to find out if there are any coalition assets available to meet those needs. Otherwise, agencies need to be contacting their local Emergency Mgmt. Agency to begin the process of requesting and receiving assistance.</li> <li>Regarding communication during an emergency, Dave discussed that we, on behalf of the coalition, would do our part to provide situational awareness amongst members as well as bridge the communication gap between individual agencies and our state partners. However, Dave and JT also need to first be made aware of an agency's emergency before we can aid in the response. If we don't know when something is happening, we can't help that agency resolve unmet needs.</li> <li>This committee also reviewed our regional Hazard Vulnerability Analysis. Dave mentioned that in approximately two years, the coalition will once again compile an updated, comprehensive HVA based on hazards and vulnerabilities identified by all coalition members within our region. A request for response will be sent by email asking for each agency's top vulnerabilities.  • As we come to the end of this fiscal year, that will also coincide with the end of our Healthcare Preparedness Program's 5-year budget cycle. We have yet to find out what changes, if any, will occur regarding our federal funding. However, in order to maintain our coalition's resiliency against our identified hazards, we will want to find creative means to supplement any funding challenges. This will primarily be addressed by increasing funding streams through our 501(c)(3) status.	
EmPower Data	<ul> <li>Dave presented our regional EmPower data, which is required to be shared with coalition members twice a year. This data compiles the number of beneficiaries through Medicaid and Medicare that have been identified as electricity dependent and therefore vulnerable during disasters. These individuals are electricity dependent because of their need for various durable, medical and assistive equipment.</li> </ul>	
LTC Subcommittee Change to Senior Living Communities	<ul> <li>The coalition's Long-Term Care subcommittee will now be called the Senior Living Communities subcommittee in an effort to engage with Assisted Living and Memory Care agencies affected by the CMS changes regarding these facilities following a medical model. Lauren Sword, the coalition's LTC representative on our Executive Committee, presented at a previous coalition meeting the changes and associated challenges these facilities will face and are already facing.
